## How will I be assessed/examined?

There are two examinations in English Language and two examinations in English Literature.

Students will receive a GCSE grade 8 -1 (8 being the highest, one being the lowest.) Students sit the same examination regardless of ability; there are no longer tiers (Higher/Foundation). Current advice is that a high 4 or low 5 will be the equivalent of a C grade.
