COMPUTER SCIENCE	<p>Review notes on topics below, but only weaker subjects, cannot revise entire curriculum. Summarise notes, create mind maps if helps, act of writing rather than typing will help recall information:</p> <p>(1) Computer Systems: Memory (RAM, ROM etc), Storage (optical, magnetic, solid state), Networks (routers, switches, IP addresses etc), System Security (threats and prevention) and Ethical, Legal, Cultural and Environmental Concerns.</p> <p>(2) Computational Thinking, Algorithms & Programming: Data Representation (binary & hexadecimal, ASC11, sound & images), Logic Gates and Truth tables, searching and sorting algorithms and programming techniques (reading algorithms & creating your own).</p> <p>Content of exam paper will be split evenly between above topics.
